Itinerary

Day 1: Arrival

The team will arrive in Siem Reap City and transfer to one of our community camps (approx. 3.5hrs). Settle into the accommodation and receive a full safety and orientation briefing before a walking tour of the local community and project sites. After dinner, the group will be given a short lesson on the history of Cambodia and the rise and fall of the Khmer Rouge regime.

Day 2 – 5: Community Project Work

The next four days will be spent on vital, sustainable project work based on the needs of the local community at the time of travel. Our projects are designed to improve the living standards of a rural community who live below the poverty line and have limited access to sanitation and medical facilities as well as education. There will also be the opportunity to interact, teach English and play games with the local children.

Day 6: Transfer to Siem Reap City

After a final breakfast in camp, the team will be transferred to Siem Reap City and check in to a central hotel. Visit the Angkor Artisan Workshop to see local craftsman making traditional Khmer items which can also be bought as souvenirs before visiting the local Old Market. The group will eat at a local restaurant in the city before experiencing the famous Phare Cambodian Circus.

Day 7: Angkor Temple Tour

Today, is a full day of sightseeing and visiting the world-renowned temples of Cambodia including Angkor Wat and Ta Prohm – made famous by the Lara Croft: Tomb Raider films and the Buddha face temple of Bayon. Experience a traditional Khmer dinner and dance show before returning to the hotel for rest and relaxation.

Day 8: Departure

Transfer to Siem Reap International Airport for the team's departure flight home.

Its ancient and mystical temples attract thousands of visitors each year and the huge historical masterpiece of Angkor Wat is a must see.

In the village surrounding our Community camp, many people live below the poverty line and homes do not have basic facilities which are vital for health and sanitation. You'll help to improve living conditions by building wells to provide water access to the village and constructing toilets for local families.
